

# ProgressBook Online Activities (for Parents)

Your child may be assigned online activities such as quizzes or discussions. These activities can be completed only on your child's ProgressBook account—parent/guardian ProgressBook accounts have read-only access to them. Students and parents can access these activities from the **Planner** screen or from the **Activities** screen as shown below.

The Anti-Communism hearings were called 'witch-hunts' because of how similar they were to the Salem Witch trials. Both situations made people very nervous and afraid. In both cases, the courts were ruled by 'you were guilty unless you confess'. In the Salem Witch trials the only way to escape death was to confess and repent. In the Anti-Communism hearings whether you were guilty or not, you were always viewed as a Communist.
